Did you know that the U.S. Forest Service has issued a new Travel Management Rule that mandates all motorized travel on national forest lands will be done on designated routes only? This means that, in the future, if your favorite trail is not on a published map it will be illegal for you to ride on it!

The National Off-Highway Vehicle Conservation Council (NOHVCC), with sponsorship from the Motorcycle Industry Council, Specialty Vehicle Institute of America, and Americans for Responsible Recreational Access, is hosting a series of national workshops to help the public and the Forest Service implement this far-reaching rule.

Design of the workshop sessions was a collaborative effort by professional trail consultants, ARRA, MIC, SVIA, American Motorcyclist Association (AMA), BlueRibbon Coalition (BRC), United Four Wheel Drive Associations (UFWDA), and the NOHVCC, with input from USFS trail managers.
