



Important!! New Rules for 2011

1) A new structure for the Junior classes has been adopted. The classes will be as follows:

Junior C: Up to 8 years old at the first race of the season. 50cc 2 and 4-stroke.

Junior Beginner: Up to 11 years old at the first race of the season. Up to 65cc 2-stroke or 110cc 4-stroke.

Junior Amateur: Up to 15 years old at the first race of the season. Up to 112cc 2-stroke or 150cc 4-stroke. Rides same course at same time as Junior Beginner.

Junior Expert: Up to 15 years old at first race of the season. Up to 112cc 2-stroke or 150cc 4-stroke. Rides same course at same time as Women, Beginner and Sportsman.

2) The Junior class number plate colors will align with the other classes, and will be as follows:

Junior Expert (JX) : **Blue** backgrounds with **White** numbers

Junior Amateur(JA): **Yellow** backgrounds with **Black** numbers

Junior Beginner(JB): **White** backgrounds with **Black** numbers

Junior C (JC): No mandatory colors

3) The Junior ATV classes will align more closely with the Junior Motorcycle classes; the classes will be as follows:

Junior C: 8 years old or younger at the first race of the season; up to 70cc 2 stroke and 4 stroke; class designation will be "JJ"; no mandatory number plate colors.

Junior Amateur: 11 years old or younger at the first race of the season; up to 90cc 2 stroke OR 125cc 4 stroke; class designation will be "JD"; number plate colors will be yellow backgrounds with Black numbers.

Junior Expert: 15 years old or younger at the first race of the season; up to 200cc 2 stroke OR 350cc 4 stroke; class designation will be "JH"; number plate colors will be Blue backgrounds with White numbers. Rides same course at same time as Women, Beginner and Sportsman.

4) The 200, Open, 30, and 40 **Beginner** classes will be condensed into one Beginner class. "B" will be the designated letter for all classes.

5) There will be a new class titled "Vet AA". Details of the class:

-To be eligible, the rider must be 38 years old or older. Any person who qualifies for the mandatory AA class at the end of the year who is 38 years old or older will automatically be put into the Vet AA class. The class will also be filled by the 40 expert class via the normal transfer system.

-Number plate colors will be **Red** backgrounds with **White** numbers

-The letter designation will be **VA**

6) Only the AA, and Vet AA class shall run **Red** backgrounds with **White** numbers.

7) The OMRA will permit electric motorcycles/ATV's to compete in the **Open**, or **Age** designated classes only (no cc limited classes, ex: 200).

8) The OMRA will adopt the **AMA RPV** transfer point system, to replace the current transfer system.

9) Team races will not be permitted within an individual (non-team) series.

10) The OMRA will require a satisfactory risk management plan to be in place by the clubs to hold an event, prior to the event date.

11) The OMRA, in addition to publishing BOD meeting location and times, will publish an agenda of topics through the OMRA website.
